Our readings today remind us that God's ways are far beyond our					
understanding. Jeremiah knew that he was to be a prophet and understood God's word to the people of Israel at that					
time (Jeremiah 1:4). But he didn't know that centuries later, his prophecies would be fully realized in Jesus.					
He knew only in part. Only God knows fully.					
In our Gospel, Jesus chided the people in the synagogue for dismissing Him as "the son of Joseph" (Luke 4:22). They had heard His remarkable teaching, but they couldn't get past the Jesus they had known for thirty years.					
They knew only in part. Only God knows fully.					
Even St. Paul, whose understanding helped form the Scriptures, acknowledged, "At present I know partially;					
then I shall know fully, as I am fully known" (1 Corinthians 13:12). As much as Paul had learned about God, he knew					
that it was only the smallest glimmer of God's goodness and glory. Like Paul, we see indistinctly, dimly, as in a					
mirror or a darkened room. Only God knows fully.					

But God knows you fully, better than you know yourself! Even more, in His wisdom, He knows the plan for your life. He knows what you will face in the future, and He is pouring out grace to prepare you even now.

Life is a mystery. Some things you will only understand in heaven—and that is where faith comes in.

Faith in the loving God who knows everything. And one day, He will reveal it all. *"Thank you, Lord, that I am fully known and fully loved."*
