Blessed are you. (Luke 6:21)

Jesus' words to the crowd sounded innocent enough at first. Who wouldn't want the poor, the hungry, and the sorrowful to find blessing? Surely they've suffered enough! But then he went on: "Woe to you who are rich. . . . Woe to you who laugh" (Luke 6:24, 25).

Questions probably started swirling in the people's minds when they heard this. Did Jesus want people to be unhappy? Were the successful going to be judged harshly because they had a good life? But Jesus wanted his hearers to ask different questions: Which group do I fit into? Why have I come here today?

The poor, the hungry, the sorrowful: these are the ones who know their need for Jesus. They know they have nothing on their own that can truly satisfy them. And so they come to Jesus so that he can fill the emptiness in their hearts. The rich, the comfortable, the happy: these are the ones who don't feel much need for Jesus—at least not in the way the others do. Maybe they had come that day to see what all the fuss was about or to listen to an interesting speaker. They had not come to be filled—and certainly not to be challenged like this!

Of course, Jesus wasn't condemning out of hand anyone who fell into the "rich" category. He was offering them a chance to change. He was asking them to make room in their hearts for him and his teaching.

You can ask yourself similar questions at Mass today: Why have I come here? Am I here to be fed and filled up?

Are there areas of my life where I feel comfortable keeping Jesus at arm's length?

Jesus is waiting for you today. He wants to give you the riches of his mercy, the joy of his love, and the Bread of eternal life. So come to him hungry and empty. Come and let him fill you.

"Lord, help me to be humble before you. Let me hear you say to me, 'Blessed are you."
