## Synod Update – Walking Together

The Final Report from the Diocesan phase of the Synod is now available in English and French on our website https://www.padiocese.ca/synod2023

The prayer and consultation that took place during this Diocesan phase identified six main priorities for our parishes to focus on. These were condensed in the conclusion of the report:



- communion | participation | mission
- Ongoing opportunities for listening to each other to continue healing and reconciliation in our par-1. ishes as we become more a Church that journeys together, particularly, with our Indigenous brothers and sisters.
- 2. Ongoing opportunities for learning how to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit as parishes and the diocese discern the path forward at this time. Continuation of the synodal journey that has begun.
- Initiatives that will teach us how with trust in the Holy Spirit to accompany others where they 3. are at on their faith journey especially those who feel separated or marginalized in our communities and schools.
- 4. Greater emphasis on outreach to those in our parishes who need support and those in need in our communities both local and global.
- Ongoing faith formation for all age groups focused on kerygmatic catechesis, which includes op-5. portunities for encountering Christ.
- Ongoing formation for clergy and parish leadership to aid in the implementation of these initiatives 6. in areas such as liturgy, RCIA, the new Directory for Catechesis, accompaniment. evangelization, etc.

As a way of moving forward together, each parish will reflect on the Final Report and then we will be invited to prayerfully make some choices.

All parishes will be expected to choose 2 of the initiatives to focus on in the 2022-2023 pastoral year. We will submit these choices to the Diocese and then we will consider our choices at the
