World Mission Sunday— Today October 23rd. One of the essential attitudes to every missionary action is humility. For the mission belongs to Christ. The Holy Spirit inspires in us both the will and work according to His good pleasure. *"Every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ, and the Church, the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. To evangelize is the very identity of the Church"* Please join the universal Church in these efforts to bring faith, hope and love to our sisters and brothers in mission countries. World Mission Sunday is a timely opportunity for us to demonstrate that we are missionary disciples. Let us pray for an increase in our own missionary spirit, that we may be fervent in our faith and in experiencing the power of God's love, in witnessing to the Gospel.



One was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. (Luke 18:10)

Let's not get off on the wrong foot with the Pharisee in this parable. He seemed to be doing pretty well spiritually. He was not greedy, dishonest, or adulterous. He fasted twice a week and went so far as to pay tithes on all his income. He prayed at the Temple regularly. That was better than most people.

So why did Jesus say he didn't go home justified?

Because the Temple was a place of encounter with God. A holy location where God and His children came together. This Pharisee seemed to be missing that connection with the Lord.

Instead of speaking his prayer to God, he prayed "to himself" (Luke 18:11) and itemized his accomplishments. By focusing on his righteous acts, he was not really making himself present to God. He wasn't inviting God to be present to him either. So he missed the chance to encounter God and receive His mercy and grace. In that sense, the Pharisee left the Temple basically the same way he had entered.

The tax collector, on the other hand, laid himself bare before God. He knew his failings and unworthiness and had no list of righteous acts to display to God. He opened his heart and begged for mercy. There, in that vulnerable, humble moment, God and man came together in a real way.

And as a result, the tax collector went home a new man.

Prayer isn't always a raw, gut-wrenching experience like the tax collector had.

But if we want to encounter God as we pray, we do need to approach Him with honesty and humility.

We need to open our hearts to God and ask Him to come in.

When you go to Mass today, you'll be entering a holy place where God and His children come together.

Come, like the tax collector, without pretense and ready to receive His grace and mercy.

"God, you alone are holy. I open my heart and invite you to cleanse me. Make me like you!"
