A Vocation View: The new ministry of "Deacon" is mentioned in today's Scripture. Perhaps the Lord is calling you to assist with the charitable, educational or liturgical needs of the Lord's People today. **Prayer:** For a deeper faith, hope and love among all Christians in Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life and especially among those He is calling to do the works that He does as a priest, deacon or consecrated religious, we pray to the Lord.

Action: A DEACON is a man with a vocation (call) from the Holy Spirit to embody and make visible the service (diakonia) of Jesus in the Church and to the world. The deacon's service is rooted in Love and makes God's love visible in a three-fold way: in the ministry of the Word, in the ministry of Sacrament, and in the ministry of Charity and Justice. Through the deacon's ministry, we see a clearer image (icon) of Christ the Servant. We see Love in action!



In addition to the myriad feast days honouring **Our Lady** under her many titles and virtues, the **entire month of May** is especially given to her praise. In the words of Pope Paul VI, May is "a month which the piety of the faithful has long dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God ... For this is the month during which Christians, in their churches and their homes, offer the Virgin Mother more fervent and loving acts of homage and veneration; and it is the month in which a greater abundance of God's merciful gifts comes down to us from our Mother's throne."

Our Grow Hope Saskatchewan fundraiser launched on May 1st


lan, Patrick and Reg Sonntag and their families farm together in the Goodsoil area

What's your dream home? Maybe it's a beachfront villa or a cabin on a picturesque mountainside. Maybe it's a castle high on a hill or a modern apartment in a bustling city. Each of us has a different picture of what

is ideal. When Jesus told His disciples that He was returning to the Father in today's Gospel, He said He was going to prepare a place for them. And just as it is with our dream homes, those heavenly abodes aren't one size fits all.

In fact, there's one that is made just for you!

Does this mean each one of us gets our own personal "dream home" in heaven? Yes and no. Heaven isn't a resort filled with personalized vacation homes. But it is very real, and it's a place where each of us receives the deep rest and refreshment we need. The Catechism tells us that heaven is "the ultimate end and

fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness" (1024). That means that Jesus has each of us in mind as He prepares to bring us to our perfect dwelling place.

He knows us through and through. He knows our deepest yearnings.

He knows what makes for our ultimate happiness. And He is preparing a place suited just for us. But that "place" is so much more than a dwelling. It's where we will find God himself, the One who quenches every thirst and satisfies every longing. Nothing that we currently experience could add to the happiness that we will know when we see the Lord, our God, face-to-face! We will be with Him fully and without hindrance.

Our eyes will be opened to the beauty and holiness and power of God, and that vision will take our breath away.
