Food for Thought! From the Diocesan Liturgy Coordinator—Heidi Epp

We often lose sight of the fact that the whole assembly celebrates. In the activity of the whole community we experience God in our celebrations. For *"in the liturgy God is speaking to his people and Christ is still proclaiming his gospel… And the people are responding to God by both song and prayer"* (CSL, 33).

We have truly participated in our Eucharistic celebration when, open to the Spirit of God working within us, we carry our "Amen" to the world we live in. Sunday is not an isolated moment in the week. We are sent forth to rebuild relationships within our families and communities, to reach out to the poor and the oppressed, to be conscious of the needs of the people and the

world that we live in, and to proclaim the Good News of salvation day after day, month after month, year after year.

Good liturgy is not magic. Good liturgy does not just happen. You can sing with a badly tuned piano but how much better the sound and the participation when the instrument is finely tuned. We are God's instruments. God's grace will still continue to work even if the liturgy is poorly enacted and ministers are poorly prepared, yet how powerful the sound when we are all well-prepared and well-tuned.

Our Lady of Good Counsel—April 26th In return for financial assistance in renovating the church of St. Mary Major in Rome, Pope Sixtus III granted land to the people of Genazzano, Italy. Eventually, a church was consecrated to Our Lady of Good Counsel, was built there and entrusted to the care of the Augustinian Order. Mysteriously, an Albanian icon, Our Lady of Shkodra (Good Counsel), arrived at this church in April 1467. The image depicts Mary and the Christ Child. Numerous healings and miracles have been attributed to the intercession of Our Lady of Good Counsel. She is the patroness of many women's groups, including the Catholic Women's League of Canada.

On the Vine: Scott Hahn Reflects on the 5th Sunday of Easter



In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be—the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations (see Sirach 24:17-24).

In Baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist.

Paul in today's First Reading seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine—His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, Paul encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life (see <u>Matthew 7:16–20</u>).

We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness.

Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us—as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as pruning, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness (see <u>Hebrews 12:4–11</u>).

We need to always remain rooted in Him, as today's Epistle tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us (see <u>Colossians 3:16</u>), and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing.

As we sing in today's Psalm, we must fulfill our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives.
